

### **TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION #TA-10-2012-1**

Pursuant to section 22a-6k(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes (“CGS”) the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection (“Commissioner”) hereby issues a Temporary Authorization (“Authorization”) to conduct the following work required to prevent damage from, and secure structures damaged by, Hurricane Sandy as is more specifically described below in the SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION. The work performed shall conform to the terms and conditions of this Authorization.

The purpose of this authorization is to prevent catastrophic damage to public interest, human health or the environment by authorizing temporary measures to protect coastal structures.

### **SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION**

The following temporary activities are hereby approved in tidal wetlands and waterward of the Coastal Jurisdiction Line in tidal, Coastal, or Navigable Waters in the State of Connecticut:

1. Pre-storm activities - Temporary placement of sandbags and relocation of sand from adjacent areas landward of mean high water using heavy equipment or hand-held equipment;
2. Post-storm activities - Temporary placement of sandbags, scaffolding, hay bales, silt fencing, steel or wooden plates or sheeting and/or bracing; and
3. Use of equipment to place and remove material authorized in item 1., above, and to remove storm debris.

### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

1. **This Authorization shall expire on January 24, 2013. All temporary structures must be removed by this date if not otherwise authorized pursuant to Sections 22a-32, 22a-361, 22a-363b, or 22a-363d of the Connecticut General Statutes.**
2. No sand shall be removed from vegetated dune areas or from areas waterward of mean high water.
3. All waste material generated by the performance of the work authorized herein shall be disposed of by the Authorization Holder at an upland site approved for the disposal of such waste material, as applicable.
4. Excavation or placement of fill not otherwise described in the Scope of Authorization is not authorized herein.
5. Any equipment used in a tidal wetland to remove debris shall be low ground pressure track-mounted equipment that does not exceed 3 pounds per square inch (psi) on the wetland surface. Low ground pressure mats specified for generating a total ground pressure that does not exceed 3 psi may be used as an alternative.

6. Except as specifically authorized by this Authorization, no equipment or material, including but not limited to, fill, construction materials, excavated material or debris, shall be deposited, placed or stored in any wetland or watercourse on or off-site, nor shall any wetland or watercourse be used as a staging area or accessway other than as provided herein.
7. Upon completion of any work authorized hereunder, all areas impacted by construction or used as a staging area or accessway in connection with such work, shall be restored to their condition prior to the commencement of such work.
8. Any document required to be submitted to the Commissioner under this Authorization or any contact required to be made with the Commissioner shall, unless otherwise specified in writing by the Commissioner, be directed to:

9. This Authorization may be revoked, suspended, or modified in accordance with applicable law.
10. Representatives of the Commissioner shall be allowed to inspect the work authorized herein at reasonable times to ensure that it is being or has been accomplished in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Authorization.
11. No work may be conducted waterward of the Coastal Jurisdiction Line or in tidal wetlands at this site other than work authorized herein, unless otherwise authorized by the Commissioner pursuant to 22a-32, 22a-361, 22a-363b, or 22a-636d of the Connecticut General Statutes.
12. The issuance of this authorization does not relieve the Authorization Holder of their obligations to obtain any other approvals required by applicable federal, state and local law.
13. This Authorization is subject to and does not derogate any present or future property rights or powers of the state of Connecticut, and conveys no property rights in real estate or material nor any exclusive privileges, and is further subject to any and all public and private rights and to any federal, state or local laws or regulations pertinent to the property or activity affected hereby.

### **TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION No TA-Sandy-10-2012-2**

Pursuant to section 22a-6k(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes (“CGS”) the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection (“Commissioner”) hereby issues a Temporary Authorization (“Authorization”) to conduct the following work required to abate damage in coastal areas from Storm Sandy as is more specifically described below in the SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION. The work performed shall conform to the terms and conditions of this Authorization.

#### **SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION**

The following temporary activities are hereby approved waterward of the Coastal Jurisdiction Line in Tidal, Coastal, or Navigable Waters in the State of Connecticut:

temporary use of equipment to replace the sand displaced by Storm Sandy onto the beach.

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

1. **This Authorization shall expire on January 28, 2013.**
2. Sand replacement authorized herein shall be located landward of mean high water.
3. Sand containing debris or visible oil or chemical contamination, or which may reasonably be expected to contain oil or chemical contamination, shall not be placed on any beach.
4. **Placement of fill not otherwise described in the Scope of Authorization is not authorized herein.** No sand other than displaced beach sand may be used on any beach under this Authorization.
5. No sand may be moved from or placed in any tidal wetland under this Authorization.
6. Within 14 days of completion of work authorized at the site, the following information must be submitted to the Commissioner:
  - a. Name and address of the property owner of the site where the work was conducted,
  - b. Location of the site where the work was conducted,
  - c. A description of the work that was conducted, and;
  - d. Photographs of the site showing conditions at the site before and after the authorized work has been conducted.
7. Except as specifically authorized by this Authorization, no equipment or material, including but not limited to, fill, construction materials, excavated material or debris, shall be deposited, placed or

stored in any wetland or watercourse on or off-site, nor shall any wetland or watercourse be used as a staging area or accessway other than as provided herein.

8. Upon completion of any work authorized hereunder, all areas impacted by construction or used as a staging area or accessway in connection with such work, shall be restored to their condition prior to the commencement of such work.
9. Any document required to be submitted to the Commissioner under this Authorization or any contact required to be made with the Commissioner shall, unless otherwise specified in writing by the Commissioner, be directed to:

### **EMERGENCY AUTHORIZATION No. EA-Sandy-10-2012-3**

Pursuant to Section 22a-363d of the Connecticut General Statutes (“CGS”) the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection (“Commissioner”) hereby issues an Emergency Authorization (“Authorization”) to conduct the following work required to abate damage in coastal areas from Storm Sandy as is more specifically described below in the SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION. The work performed shall conform to the terms and conditions of this Authorization.

The purpose of this authorization is to allow immediate repairs to flood and erosion control structures in order to avoid catastrophic damage to human health and property.

#### **SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION**

The following activities are hereby approved waterward of the Coastal Jurisdiction Line in Tidal, Coastal, or Navigable Waters in the State of Connecticut:

1. Placement of riprap on slopes behind existing, damaged seawalls; and
2. Repair and/or rebuilding to the pre-existing condition of seawalls, bulkheads and riprap revetments that have been previously authorized, have been in place since before January 1, 1995 or that serve to protect public infrastructure or a residence that has been in place since before January 1, 1995.

**INITIATION OF ANY WORK AUTHORIZED HEREIN CONSTITUTES ACCEPTANCE AND AGREEMENT TO COMPLY WITH ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AUTHORIZATION.**


#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

1. **This Authorization shall expire on April 30, 2013.**
2. No later than 30 days following the expiration date, the Authorization Holder shall submit a complete permit or certificate of permission application for the retention or continuation of the work authorized herein.
3. Such permit or certificate of permission application for a flood and erosion control structure not previously authorized or not in place prior to June 24, 1939 shall contain a request and appropriate information to support the retention of such structure in addition to whatever repairs were made.
4. Placement of riprap pursuant to Scope of Authorization paragraph 1., above, shall not be placed any further waterward than the landward face of the existing seawall, portions that remain of the seawall, or the location where the seawall originally existed.
5. Seawalls and bulkheads repaired or replaced pursuant to Scope of Authorization paragraph 2., above, shall be no further waterward than, and no taller than, the pre-existing structure. Such repairs may include the addition of subgrade footings.

6. Placement of fill not otherwise described in the Scope of Authorization is not authorized herein.
7. Work in tidal wetlands is not authorized herein.
8. Except as specifically authorized by this Authorization, no equipment or material, including but not limited to, fill, construction materials, excavated material or debris, shall be deposited, placed or stored in any wetland or watercourse on or off-site, nor shall any wetland or watercourse be used as a staging area or accessway other than as provided herein.
9. Upon completion of any work authorized hereunder, all areas impacted by construction or used as a staging area or accessway in connection with such work, shall be restored to their condition prior to the commencement of such work.

### **TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION No TA-Sandy-10-2012-4**

Pursuant to section 22a-6k(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes (“CGS”) the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection (“Commissioner”) hereby issues a Temporary Authorization (“Authorization”) to conduct the following work required to abate damage in coastal areas from Storm Sandy as is more specifically described below in the SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION. The work performed shall conform to the terms and conditions of this Authorization.

#### **SCOPE OF AUTHORIZATION**

The following temporary activities are hereby approved in tidal wetlands and waterward of the Coastal Jurisdiction Line in Tidal, Coastal, or Navigable Waters in the State of Connecticut:

Temporary use of equipment to reset fallen stones displaced by Storm Sandy from any seawall, bulkhead, retaining wall or riprap revetment currently covered for this type of repair in DEP-LIS-GP-014, “General Permit for Minor Seawall Repairs.”

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**


1. **This Authorization shall expire on January 28, 2013.**
2. Any equipment that is used on the waterward side of any such seawall, bulkhead, or revetment shall not enter into any tidal wetland, shall not disturb any dune, and shall not enter the water at any time.
3. Within 14 days of completion of work authorized at the site, the following information must be submitted to the Commissioner:
  - a. Name and address of the property owner of the site where the work was conducted,
  - b. Location of the site where the work was conducted,
  - c. A description of the work that was conducted, and;
  - d. Photographs of the site showing conditions at the site before and after the authorized work has been conducted.
4. Except for the use of equipment in lieu of the condition requiring all work to be done by hand, all conditions of DEP-LIS-GP-014 are incorporated into this Temporary Authorization.
5. Upon completion of any work authorized hereunder, all areas impacted by construction or used as a staging area or accessway in connection with such work, shall be restored to their condition prior to the commencement of such work.
